Toddlers 12-36 months	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Not walking by 15 months • Walking on tip toes more than 3 months after starting to walk • Frequent falling or tripping • Difficulty navigating changes in floor surfaces • Showing leg preferences with activities like stepping up and down 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Difficulty with dressing and undressing themselves • Difficulties with self-feeding (fork/spoon use, adequate chewing) • Limited play skills with toys and other children • Sensory difficulties with food textures, movement, sounds, and touch experiences 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Difficulty following simple 1-2 step directions • Not using a lot of new words • Doesn't respond to simple questions • Difficulty putting multiple words together • Difficulty with saying the following sounds within words: p, b, m, h, n, d, and w sounds
Preschool age 36-60 months	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Frequent falls or tripping • Difficulty with stairs • "W" sitting • Walking on tip toes • Trouble keeping up with other kids on the playground • Difficulty with running or jumping 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Picky eater • Difficulty attending to tasks • Difficulty with school skills such as: using scissors, holding a pencil, crayon or marker, drawing shapes, coloring • Difficulty with fasteners: buttoning buttons, starting a zipper on a jacket etc. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Friends and family have difficulty understanding what the child is saying • Difficulty learning new words quickly • Isn't using words like "I, me, you, in, on, or under" • Inability to use 3 word sentences
